Doing business ethically: the professional's contribution - Philippa Foster Back, Director, Institute of Business Ethics

The current mandate of the Office of Tax Simplification expires with the next election in May. This session will review the current state of play on the OTS's recommendations arising from its reports on Employee Benefits & Expenses, Partnerships, Penalties and UK Competitiveness, including developments in the 18 March Budget and subsequent Finance Bill/Act. John will also outline the OTS's conclusions and recommendations on Employment Status, and give you the opportunity to voice your opinion on what should happen next with Tax Simplification in an audience discussion.

2. New charity SORPs - John Selwood, Chartered Accountant and Independent Training Consultant

If you work for a charity, it's essential you're up to speed on the latest regulations.

The impact of New UK GAAP has given rise to two new Charity SORPs, one for small charities and one for the rest. Regardless of which one applies to you, there are likely to be many significant differences for all charities, which include; changes to the Trustees Annual Report, a new layout for the Statement of Financial Activities, a new cashflow statement, new disclosures, changes to accounting for grants and changes to accounting for donated goods and services.

3. Influencing decision makers - Sonia Saxton, Director, Saxton Partners

Sonia Saxton, an entrepreneur and international behavioural expert, will teach you how to influence decision makers.
